


How to Access a Live Webinar on ArtsU



To access a live event, you must be logged in to ArtsU. To log in, locate and press the red LOG IN button on the left side of the page. Enter your username and password when prompted. 

Return to the page five minutes before the event, and you will be invited to join the webinar via a pop-up window. Press the red EARLY LOGIN IS OPEN button and the webinar will open a new window.



Alternatively, return to the page right when the webinar is scheduled to begin, and there will be a new button that says ENTER LIVE EVENT IN PROGRESS. Click on the button and you will be let into the webinar. The webinar will open in a new window.
