


### Background

- You are responsible for housing, travel, meals outside of program and for virtual session attendance.


# Regional Locations

### Program Components Cont'd

#### 7 x 7s

Mini-talks aimed to help Fellows expand their insider knowledge at the highest levels of arts management

#### Reflections

Regular opportunities to strengthen personal and professional reflective practice

#### Mini-Challenges

Practice

studies likely
experienced as
senior leaders
pushing for equity

#### **Culminating Project**

Higher-stakes challenge fellows complete in collaboration with lead faculty based on a relevant issue.

# Eligibility + Timeline

12 fellows selected from Chicago, Cleveland, and Indianapolis (four fellows from each) through competitive application.

#### Each applicant MUST

- Be available for all scheduled events
- Self-identify as a person of color and/or ALAANA;
- Be an emerging/mid-career arts professional with 1 15 years in the field
- Be employed full-time at an organization with at least two full-time staff;
- Live in Chicago, Cleveland, or Indianapolis at the time of application.



#### Highly competitive applicants include

- evidence of a commitment to cultivating personal and professional skills needed to ascend in arts leadership
- a demonstrated interested in promoting cultural equity;
- promise as a risk-taker and innovator of programs, policies, or practices in organization or community.

Priority Deadline: March 20 11:59 p.m. EST Final Deadline: March 27 11:59 p.m. EST



- Read thoroughly.
- Complete application in separate document.
- Focus the most attention on your essays.
