Summa Health

- Nonprofit health system in the greater Akron, Ohio area that encompasses a network of hospitals, community-based health centers, a health plan, a multi-specialty group practice, an accountable care organization, research and medical education, and a foundation.
- Serves more than one million patients throughout our five-market region each year in comprehensive acute, critical, emergency, outpatient and long-term/home-care settings and represent more than 1,300 licensed inpatient beds at Summa Health System Akron, Barberton and St. Thomas Campuses and Summa Rehab Hospital.
- Contributes **\$2.7 billion** in business volume impact to the Ohio economy.
- Serves more than one million patients, and employs over 8,000



Benefits of a Healing Environment

- Lowers blood pressure
- Curbs anxiety and depression
- Promotes relaxation
- Reduces pain by increasing production of endorphins; and
- Enhances production of proteins that accelerate healing and lower the danger of infection


Role of the Summa Health Healing Arts Leadership Council


Ohio connection:

From her artist statement: "I am interested in the Summa Health commission because I understand the important role art plays in healing and as an opportunity to give back to the community."






Art Commissions: Great Lawn

From her artist statement: "My mission is to create art that celebrates life, the human spirit and builds bonds between each other and the places we live, work and play."






